Topic: A session on Ashoka's Edicts (Girnar) as IKS

Objectives of the Event:

1. To revitalize cultural heritage and integrate India's rich intellectual resources to the modern education framework.
2. To integrate traditional knowledge with modern disciplines to cultivate moral, human and value based qualities in students.

Programme Highlights:

The event begun with a warm welcome by Mr. Sahab Uddin Laskar, Co-ordinator IQAC cum IIC president, introduced the theme of the topic event highlighting that India is a country where multi-cultural, multi-regional and multi-faceted environment existed and till now existing. He said that Ashoka's Edicts are the 33 inscriptions engrain in the rocks and pillars by the Mayran empyrean, Ashoka, who ruled from 268 B.C.E. to 232 B.C.E. Ashoka Edicts were the proclamations by the emperor to republic at large, Which carried the message aboiut the idea and practice of Dhamma.

Then the speaker Mr. Kokil Deka highlighted on the rich heritage of ancient Indian culture and Indigenous resources. He said that Ashoka Inscriptions were scattered throughout Afghanistan, Pakistan, India, Nepal and Bangladesh. Most of the Inscription were considered to be the first intangible evidence of Buddhism and these inscriptions were in Prakrit Language. Along with this he highlighted by saying that these inscription are categories into Major – Rock

edicts, Pillar edicts and Minor rock edicts. The Major rock edicts are the 14 major ones found at sites like Girnar and Dhauri, while the pillar edicts includes seven separate edicts found on pillars like the Delhi Topra and Sarnath Pillar.

Outcomes of the Event:

Students could learn about the principles of Dhamma “Righteousness” which include non-violence, religious tolerance and social welfare as well as the importance of compassionate and ethical leadership.

- The session was quite informative and interesting related to Indian Knowledge System.
- The Session provides valuable knowledge of historical, a linguistic record of the Mayran Empire, its size and the early spread of Buddhism.
